










#### 3.2. Average Editorial Speed (submission to final decision) per Editor, for Regular Content





Following discussion with Elsevier and the FFLM Board, in 2019 at the Annual Conference a new Editor-in-Chief will take up the post.

Tim Thompson is a Professor of Applied Biological Anthropology in the School of Science & Engineering. In 2014, Tim was awarded a National Teaching Fellowship by the Higher Education Academy for excellence in teaching and support for learning in higher education. Tim studied for his PhD at the University of Sheffield (Faculty of Medicine) and was a Lecturer in Forensic Anthropology at the University of Dundee.

He has published over 50 papers in peer-reviewed journals and books and is a renowned expert on heat-induced apatite and crystallinity changes in bone - he has recently published the book 'The Archaeology of Cremation: Burned Human Remains in Funerary Studies'. Prior to this he was co-author of 'Human Identity

and Identification' with Dr Rebecca Gowland (Durham University) and senior editor for the book 'Forensic Human Identification'. At Teesside, he is actively involved in undertaking and fostering research. On top of developing his own research team, Tim has Chaired both the School of Science & Engineering Research Ethics and Research Degrees Committees. He Chairs the University Research Ethics and Integrity Committee and the University Research Degrees Committee. He also sits on the University Research Policy Committee. He is on the editorial boards for 'Human Remains and Violence: an Interdisciplinary Journal' and 'Journal of Forensic Sciences', is Associate Editor of the 'Journal of Forensic and Legal Medicine'. He will complete a very successful three year role Editor-in-Chief of the journal 'Science & Justice' this year. He is also a Fellow of the Chartered Society of Forensic Sciences and the Royal Anthropological Institute, and is a practicing forensic anthropologist who has worked at home and abroad in a variety of forensic contexts.
