

1. Editor's Message

I am delighted to be able to introduce this latest report by saying that the Journal is having its most successful period. Within this report, we lay out a number of metrics, datasets and information which provide specific detail to this, but in summary, in 2020:

- · we had our most manuscript submissions ever, smashing the 700 article barrier which was my internal target;
- reached a Rejection Rate of 82%, which is high for our discipline but reflects the increase in submissions we are seeing. In fact, you can see that we published around the same number of articles as in previous years;
- significantly reduced the time taken for decisions to be made, with a reduction of 6 weeks for time taken to first decision (which brings us back into line with our 2018 figure where we had 200 fewer manuscripts to process) and a reduction of about 8 weeks for time taken to final editorial outcome:
- saw an increase in citations for our published articles, putting us firmly into second place for forensic journals after JFS;
- achieved over 300,000 reads, which is an incredible feat and reflects the increasingly important work we are publishing, the higher regard we are being held in, and our increased promotional work.

In addition to this, I am really pleased to see that our most cited, downloaded and social-media active articles cover a broad range of topics and sub-disciplines, which reflects the broad appeal of the Journal as well as the membership of the Faculty.






2. Manuscript Flow


2.1. Submitted Manuscripts & Editorial Outcomes







2.2. Submitted Articles by Country & Region






2.3. Accepted Articles by Country & Region







3.1. Average Editorial Speed for Accepted and Rejected Articles






