Margaret Stark has been a forensic physician since 1989, mainly working with the Metropolitan Police Service (MPS), also in Surrey, Sussex, and with British Transport Police. She was the first Medical Director of the Forensic Healthcare Service in London and the Director of the Clinical Forensic Medicine Unit for NSW Police, based in Sydney, from 2011 – 2014. Previously she was a principal in general practice and also worked in family planning.

She is the Immediate Past-President of the Faculty of Forensic & Legal Medicine (FFLM), Chair of the Forensic Science Sub-Committee, Lead Facilitator for the Faculty's course in General Forensic Medicine, and an educational advisor for the Faculty's examinations. She was the Founding Academic Dean for the FFLM. She was awarded the David Jenkins Professorship in Forensic and Legal Medicine in 2011/12 and was an Adjunct Professor at Sydney University from 2012-2015. She is an Honorary Professor of Teesside University. She also works as the Responsible Officer and Appraisal Lead for Care & Custody (Health) Ltd (part of the MITIE Group), a Deputy Crematorium Referee (Croydon) and an Expert Witness.
