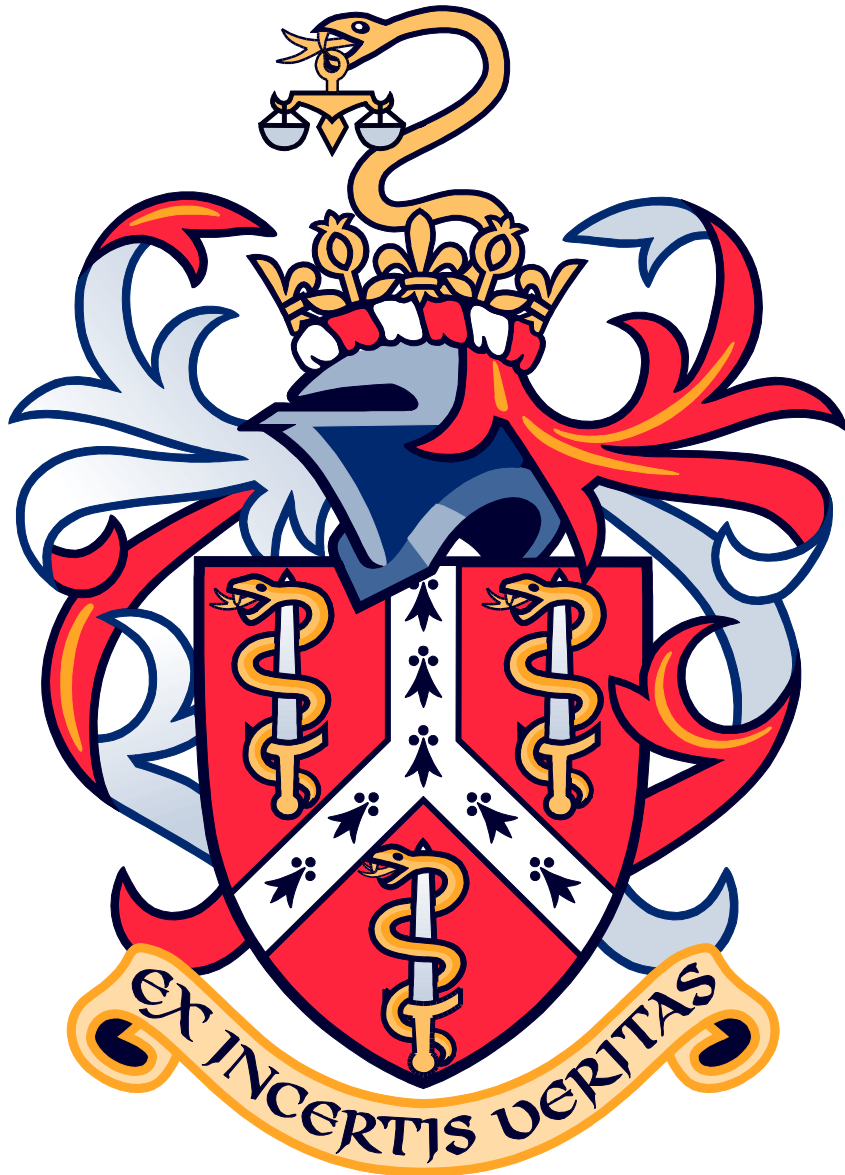

FFLM Updates and Intimate Images Guidance

Bernadette Butler, ('Dr B') graduated from St Thomas' Hospital Medical School, sometime in the last century, when there were about as many medical schools in London, as the rest of the UK. Her post-graduate career began in Obstetrics & Gynaecology, but she stepped off the 'career' ladder due to family commitments and worked part-time. She began her career in forensic medicine, almost 23 years ago, at the first Haven, in Camberwell, now one of 3 Havens: the sexual assault referral centres (SARCs) for London, run by King's College Hospital. She has an interest in education and training, hence her role as the Havens' Clinical Education & Training Lead (CETL), as well as continuing her forensic medical work on the out-of-hours rota.

Her roles within the Faculty of Forensic & Legal Medicine (FFLM) include Academic Dean (2016 – 2019), Examiner for LFFLM (SOM) and MFFLM (SOM), Member of the Forensic Science Sub-committee (FSSC) and President. Until September 2023, she is the President of the Clinical Forensic and Legal Medicine Section, at the Royal Society of Medicine, (RSM). Other roles in the past: Clinical Director of Hope House, the Gloucestershire Sexual Assault Referral Centre (SARC), Assistant Deputy Coroner for Surrey and Forensic physician at the Surrey SARC in Cobham.

Away from her clinical work, she sits as a Lay Magistrate (Justice of the Peace, JP) in Surrey. She has a fair amount of knowledge about Great Danes (dogs), of which she has owned nine over about 35 years.

Identifying the Physical Signs of Child Sexual Abuse – an Evidence Based Approach

Soon after qualifying as a GP, I worked for the US Army in Germany. Returning to the UK after 6 years, I have been ½ time GP Principal in South Bucks from 1988 to 2017, then GP in ED until May 2019.

My “portfolio career”, has included cardiology research; surgical clinics; working as a GP with homeless people in London; being medical officer of a drug and alcohol team; 13 years in ED, alongside GP work. My love is working with the vulnerable.

Since 1993 I have worked as a Forensic Physician for Thames Valley Police. Leaving general forensic work with contracting out 6 years ago, I continue as Clinical Director of the Thames Valley Sexual Assault Service.

I am medical advisor for Coraam BAAF and work with the Looked After Children team. I work as an expert witness in the UK.

I have contributed to many national documents and guidelines, both from the FFLM and the RCPCH; been one of the authors of the “purple book” both editions and am involved in the 3rd edition; Service Specifications from the RCPCH and FFLM two editions; published papers following research done; taught multiagency, police, and health professionals for many years.

I am on the FFLM Research Subcommittee and an FFLM examiner.

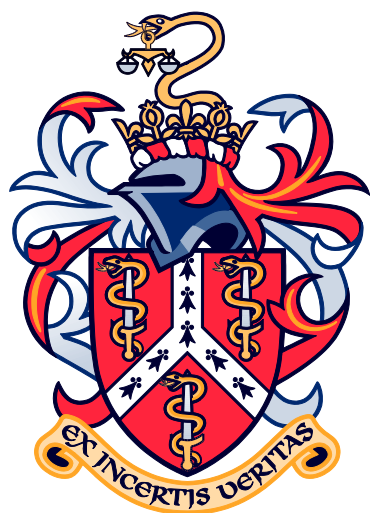
General Forensic Medicine Course
